


# NOTICE

## Venture Global Calcasieu Pass, LLC and TransCameron Pipeline, LLC File Application for Project



On Sept. 4, 2015, Venture Global Calcasieu Pass, LLC and TransCameron Pipeline, LLC, both subsidiaries of Venture Global LNG, Inc., filed a joint application with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) requesting authorization to site, construct and operate (i) Calcasieu Pass's proposed natural gas liquefaction and export terminal and (ii) TransCameron Pipeline's two proposed natural gas pipeline laterals that will connect the Calcasieu Pass LNG terminal to the U.S. natural gas grid. These developments are subject to the jurisdiction of FERC under the Natural Gas Act. FERC issued a formal notice of the applications. FERC assigned the docket numbers CP15-550 and CP15-551 to these applications.

Calcasieu Pass's proposed LNG terminal site is located near where the Calcasieu Ship Channel meets the Gulf of Mexico in Cameron Parish, Louisiana, south of the city of Lake Charles. The project site is at an ideal location due to its remote location and deep-water access.

This site location is in close proximity to several major interstate natural gas pipelines and is in the middle of one of the most active trading areas for pipeline-quality natural gas in North America and in the region - with Henry Hub and Egan Hub - as well as one of the highest densities of gas pipeline infrastructure in the United States.

Pending regulatory approval, construction is planned to take place from 2016-2019.

Some key project features are:

- A 506-acre plot with more than a mile of ship channel frontage
- Up to 12 million tonnes per annum of LNG export capacity
- Two ship loading berths for LNG vessels with carrying capacity of up to 210,000 m<sup>3</sup>
- Two 200,000 m<sup>3</sup> full-containment LNG storage units
- Two 42-inch diameter lateral pipelines, aggregately 43 miles in length, which will deliver feed gas to the liquefaction facility
- 720 MW combined cycle gas turbine power plant to power the facility
